

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# What is Bus Revolution


"Blank Slate" redesign of SEPTA's fixedroute bus network

## Why Now?

- SEPTA Forward all working together towards a more fully integrated network serving a wide variety of trips
- SEPTA has never looked at its network comprehensively before
- Between 2013 & 2019 ridership dropped 13%
  but operating costs went up 10%
- Elimination of transfer penalty in 2020 offers opportunity to rethink how people can use the system
- Bus ridership is 30-40% below pre-COVID levels





## **Draft Bus Network**

#### **Includes:**

Overall fewer routes


Straighter lines

More red & green routes

Fewer gold routes

Looks more like a grid

On-demand transit zones



## **Understanding the MAX Series**


- The Bus Revolution uses the "MAX series" to talk about bus routes.
- MAX means the <u>maximum</u> time between buses. For example, a 10 MAX route will arrive at least every 10 minutes.
- All bus routes are described as:
  - 10 MAX15 MAXFrequent Bus Service
  - 30 MAX
  - 60 MAX




Bus Revolution defines a "frequent" bus route as one that operates every 15 minutes or better.

## **Upper Northwest**

#### **Highlights**

- Most routes have all-day frequent service, 7 days/week
- Consistent schedules throughout the day
- More regional connections to WTC, FTC, and 69<sup>th</sup> Street
- Simplified and straighter alignments
- Consolidated service on some streets

## **Major Changes**

#### 10 MAX 546

 Same as existing Route 23 with simpler, more consistent schedule with similar frequencies

#### 15 MAX 526


 New route with frequent connection from Cheltenham to Wissahickon

#### 15 MAX 524


- Similar as Route H but operates on Wayne
  Avenue instead of Greene Street
- Simpler, more consistent scheduling and more frequency


#### 15 MAX 537

Similar as Route L but ends at Germantown




## What We've Heard

- Bus Revolution has received over 3,000 comments
- Nearly 60% of comments are about four SEPTA bus routes
  - Route 9 4<sup>th</sup>-Walnut to Andorra
  - Route 27 Broad-Carpenter to Plymouth Meeting Mall
  - Route 32 Broad-Carpenter to Ridge Lyceum
  - Route 49 33<sup>rd</sup>-Dauphin to 29<sup>th</sup>-Snyder

#### Key concerns

- Reduction in service levels overall
- Elimination of direct connections to Center City
- Elimination of direct connections to University City
- Requiring a transfer at 30<sup>th</sup> Street Station



## **Potential Solutions**

- Taking another look at the underlying demand and transit markets
  - Transit ridership / existing demand
  - Travel patterns
- Looking at adding back direct connections to Center City and University City
  - Roxborough-Manayunk to Center City
    - Frequent route on local streets into Center City
    - Express service into Center City
  - Direction connection to Upper Roxborough from Norristown
    - Via Metroplex


