

"Blank Slate" redesign of SEPTA's fixedroute bus network




Why Now?

- SEPTA Forward emphasizes a more fully integrated network
- SEPTA has never looked at its network comprehensively before
- Elimination of transfer penalty in 2020 offers opportunity to rethink how people can use the system and how SEPTA can allocate resources
- Between 2013 & 2019 ridership dropped 13% but operating costs went up 10% while service got slower and less reliable
- Bus ridership is 30-40% below pre-COVID levels



Introducing the Draft Bus Network



Key Takeaways from Earlier Phases



Duplication in the system makes it confusing and prevents expansion of frequent service



Many routes have complex routings, excessive patterns, and inconsistent schedules



Too much emphasis on peak hour commute trips into Center City



Some areas are overserved based on demand




Service is slow and unreliable



Riders prioritize frequency, reliability, and access (not having to walk too far)

Bus Revolution Draft Network



Draft Bus Network

Includes:

Overall fewer routes


Straighter lines

More red & green routes

Fewer gold routes

Looks more like a grid

On-demand transit zones



Understanding the MAX Series


- The Bus Revolution uses the "MAX series" to talk about bus routes.
- MAX means the <u>maximum</u> time between buses. For example, a 10 MAX route will arrive at least every 10 minutes.
- All bus routes are described as:
 - 10 MAX15 MAXFrequent Bus Service
 - 30 MAX
 - 60 MAX



Bus Revolution defines a "frequent" bus route as one that operates every 15 minutes or better.



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

Proposed Changes

- New route: 10 MAX 512
 - Combines parts of Routes 7, 48 and 49
 - Connects to Center City to Penn's Landing
- New route: 15 MAX 515
 - Fairmount/2nd to 69th Street Transportation Center via Spring Garden, Haverford and Vine
- New route: 15 MAX 510
 - Combines parts of 32 and 49
 - Roxborough/Manayunk to 30th Street Station via 29th Street,
 Girard and 33rd Street
- New route: 10 MAX 514
 - Combines 17 and 33
 - North-south on 19th and 20th between Erie Avenue and Johnston/Moyamensing
