

Why are you going to make me transfer?

Parts of the Draft Network to Keep



Increased frequency of service

Riders like increased service levels on weekend days and evenings.



Simpler network overall to enhance reliability

Riders and residents liked the simplicity of the updated network.



Focus on connectivity

New connections so people can get further, faster. This new connection will make it easier for me to get to University City.

I like that the bus would come more often. I never understood how the bus traveled down that narrow street, this new alignment makes more sense.

Why are you going to make me transfer?

We've updated the draft network to:

- Reduce the number of trips that require a transfer
- Prioritize one-seat rides for short trips
- Prioritize trips with strong ridership

What's a one-seat ride?

A one-seat ride is when you can use one bus to get you to your final destination.

Why are you eliminating my bus route?

We've updated the draft network to:

- Show routes to schools and community destinations
- Take another look at routes where we reduced or eliminated service
- Talk with community members to better understand their values and needs
- Add new service where it makes sense based on feedback and ridership

Why on-demand or microtransit service?

We've updated the draft network to include on-demand (or microtransit) zones:

- Use on-demand service to increase convenience
- Most useful in places with limited bus service and low ridership
- Adjusted based on feedback changed zone size or shape, or in some cases, brought back fixed-route service

> What's going on with school service? How is my child going to get to school?

We've updated the draft network to:

- Met with school district to better understand their needs and concerns
- Show SEPTA bus routes that connect to schools
- Add bus service back at key times to make sure there won't be overcrowding when students are traveling

I don't feel safe waiting for SEPTA. Please don't make me transfer.

We've updated the draft network to:

- Reduce the number of trips that require a transfer, including to the MFL or BSL
- Start working with partners across the region to make bus stops and transfer location safer
- Continue to focus on safety and security so everyone feels comfortable using SEPTA

What is the SCOPE program?


Scope is SEPTA's strategy to address safety, security and the challenges of the vulnerable population on our system.

I don't understand these route numbers. What's going on?

We've updated the draft network to:

- Use as much of the existing route numbers as possible
- Keep a reference to the ones we used before, for people who want them.
- Keep talking to riders about how we number and name our bus routes

Let's look at some bus routes




Dauphin to 29th Street Fairmount, West Philly, University City and Greys Ferry **Route 32/49** 33rd & Dauphin to 33rd & Dickenson Extension to Lyceum & Ridge

- More frequent at least every 15 minutes every day, all day
- Restores critical connections to University City
- Will be slightly faster because it doesn't travel into Center City
- Improves service in Mantua



Penn's Landing to 23rd & Venango Route 33 23rd & Venango Loop to Penn's Landing


- Reestablish direct connection to Center City
- Frequent at least every 15 minutes every day, all day
- Realign northbound service to 21st Street to bring closer to southbound service




Penn's Landing to 20th & Johnston

Route 17 Penn's Landing to 20th & Johnston

- Reestablish direct connection to Center City
- Frequent at least every 15 minutes every day, all day
- All service will operate to 20th & Johnston



Whitman Plaza to Rising Sun-Olney and FTC



Route 57 Dauphin & Front to Oregon (or Broad and Pattison)

Route 520 Fern Rock to Dauphin & Front


- Still proposing to split route to improve reliability and frequency
- Shift split north, more in line with travel patterns and feedback
- Frequent at least every 15 minutes every day, all day on both routes
- Every other trip on Route 57 will serve NRG Station and destinations currently served by Route G

4th-Walnut to Andorra

Route 9 Ridge & Cathedral to 5th & Market

- Retains current alignment
- Service every 30
 minutes all day, every
 day with more frequent
 at peak times

Route ends in Center City at 5th & Market for operational needs



Broad & Carpenter to Plymouth Meeting Mall Route 27 Broad & Carpenter to Plymouth Meeting Mall

- Retains current alignment
- Will serve same schools currently on route
- Service every 30
 minutes all day, every
 day with more frequent
 at peak times



Other Updates

Route 12 33rd & Dickinson Loop to Penn's Landing Re-establish service from Gray's Ferry to Center City with some changes:

- Operate on Chestnut/Walnut instead of Locust
- Begin/end Dickinson & 32nd

Routes 38/44 5th & Market to Ford & Monument (and Ardmore)

- Every 30 minutes between Center City and Wynnefield Heights. Uses Market, 34th Street, Brown 40th, 41st and Belmont.
- Every other trip (hourly service) goes to City Avenue and Ardmore.

What's Next


- Meeting people where they are at bus stops, and at transportation centers


