

Feedback Themes

- Transfers and one-seat rides
- Routes being eliminated
- Personal safety and security
- Access to schools
- Frequency
- Weekend service
- Simplicity



Parts of the Draft Network to Keep



Increased frequency of service

Riders like increased service levels on weekend days and evenings.



Simpler network overall to enhance reliability

Riders and residents liked the simplicity of the updated network.



Focus on connectivity

New connections so people can get further, faster.

Why are you going to make me transfer?

We've updated the draft network to:

- Reduce the number of trips that require a transfer
- Prioritize one-seat rides for short trips
- Prioritize trips with strong ridership

What's a one-seat ride?

A one-seat ride is when you can use one bus to get you to your final destination.

What's going on with school service? How is my child going to get to school?

We've updated the draft network to:

- Met with school district to better understand their needs and concerns
- Show SEPTA bus routes that connect to schools
- Add bus service back at key times to make sure there won't be overcrowding when students are traveling

I don't feel safe waiting for SEPTA. Please don't make me transfer.

We've updated the draft network to:

- Reduce the number of trips that require a transfer, including to the MFL or BSL
- Start working with partners across the region to make bus stops and transfer location safer
- Continue to focus on safety and security so everyone feels comfortable using SEPTA

What is the SCOPE program?


Scope is SEPTA's strategy to address safety, security and the challenges of the vulnerable population on our system.

I don't understand these route numbers. What's going on?

We've updated the draft network to:

- Use as much of the existing route numbers as possible
- Keep a reference to the ones we used before, for people who want them.
- Keep talking to riders about how we number and name our bus routes

Route 4


Broad & Pattison to Fern Rock



Proposed Route 4

Broad & Pattison to 11th & Fern Rock Transportation Center

- 15 minutes on weekdays
- 30 minutes on weekends
- Available 22 hours a day
- Connects residents along 9^{th/}
 10th Streets to Center City,
 Broad Street Line and east-west
 bus routes




Route 16

Cheltenham-Ogontz to Broad & Lehigh

Proposed Route 16

Cheltenham to Broad & Lehigh

- 15 minutes during morning and afternoon
- 30 minutes for most of the day
- Available 22 hours a day
- Restores critical connections on Cheltenham to Olney
- Will be faster and more reliable because it is shorter and more direct.




Routes 12, 29, & 79

Route 12

33rd & Dickinson Loop to Penn's Landing

- Travels on Chestnut and Walnut
- Connections along Grays Ferry Avenue
- 30-minute service weekdays and weekends




Routes 12, 29, & 79 South Philadelphia

Route 29

49th & Woodland to Pier 70

- Travels on Tasker and Morris across Gray's Ferry Bridge to 49th and Woodland
- 15-service on weekdays and weekends (10 minutes during peak periods)




Routes 12, 29, & 79


Route 79

Pier 70 to 40th & Market

- Travels on Snyder to 29th to 40th and Market Street
- Connects into West Philadelphia
- 10-minute service weekdays and weekends








Route 32/49

33rd & Dauphin Loop to 33rd & Dickinson Loop

- More frequent at least every 15 minutes every day, all day
- Restores critical connections to University City
- Will be slightly faster because it doesn't travel into Center City
- Improves service in Mantua



Route 32/49A

Lyceum & Ridge to 33rd & Dauphin Loop

- Every other trip continues north to Lyceum and Ridge
- Every 30 minutes every day, all day
- Restores critical connections to University City
- Improves service in Mantua

Other Updates

Route 17 Penn's Landing to 20th & Johnston


Reestablish direct connection to Center City

- Frequent at least every 15 minutes every day, all day
- All service will operate to 20th
 & Johnston

Route 33 23rd & Venango Loop to Penn's Landing


Reestablish direct connection to Center City

- Frequent at least every 15 minutes every day, all day
- Realign northbound service to 21st Street to bring closer to southbound service



People and Jobs within ¼ mile of Frequent Transit (Weekdays at Noon)


Access to Frequent Transit


